Note 1 Significant Accounting Policies

(i) Corporate Information

Proaction Foundation ('the Company') is a company incorporated under the provisions of The Companies Act 2013. The Company was incorporated in 2018 and this is the fourth year of operations.

(ii) Basis of Accounting & Preparation of Financial Statements

The financial statements of the Company have been prepared on accrual basis of accounting unless otherwise stated and comply with the Accounting Standards ('AS') notified under Section 133 of the Companies Act 2013, read together with Rule 7 of the Companies (Accounts) Rules 2014 and other accounting principles generally accepted in India. (Indian GAAP)

(iii) Use of Estimates

The preparation of Financial Statements in conformity with Indian GAAP requires the management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of Assets and Liabilities, the disclosure of contingent liabilities on the date of the financial statements and the income and expenses during the year. The management believes that the estimates used in the preparation of the Financial Statements are prudent and reasonable. Future results could differ due to these estimates and the differences between the actual results and the estimates are recognised in the period in which the results are known / material.

(iv) Cash & Cash equivalents

'Cash' comprises of cash in hand and equivalents, which are readily convertible into known amounts of cash and which are subject to insignificant risk of changes in value.

(v) Cash Flow Statement

The Cash Flow Statement is reported using the indirect method, whereby profit / (loss) before tax is adjusted for the effects of transactions of non cash nature and any deferrals are accruals of past or future cash receipts or payments. The cash flow from operating, investing and financing activities of the company are segregated based on available information.

(vi) Expenditure

Expenses are accounted on accrual basis and provisions are made for all known losses and liabilities.

(vii) Earnings Per Share

The Earnings per share has been reported in accordance with Accounting Standards (AS -20). Basic earnings per equity share have been computed by dividing net profit after tax attributable to equity shareholders by the numbers of equity shares outstanding during the year.

(viii) Taxation

The Company is a company registered under Section 8 of the Companies Act 2013. The Company has been formed for promoting charitable activities. The Company is registered under Section 12A of the Income Tax Act 1961 for exemption of Income Tax.

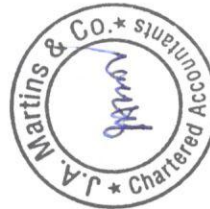

To the Members of Proaction Foundation
Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements

Opinion

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of **PROACTION FOUNDATION** ("the Company"), which comprise the Balance Sheet as at 31st March 2025, the Statement of Profit and Loss for the year then ended, and Statement of Cash Flow for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

Note 1 Significant Accounting Policies

(i) Corporate Information

(vii) Earnings Per Share
